Moira (pronounced 'More-uh') has influenced a generation of young a cappella and choral singers to study and perform folk harmony repertoires, body percussion, and new, polyphonic song. She inspires singers to use their voice as an instrument - a tool for composing, improvising, and arranging.

CONCERTS WITH TALK/DISCUSSION

Moira's touring show threads traditional folk songs between her own songwriting, body percussion, loops, and storytelling. Any concert can include a pre- or post-show talk/discussion. Specialty programs include:

VOCO – quartet of extraordinary voices, folk-based, avant-garde leaning, and physical.

The Voice is a Traveler — original & traditional folk songs, unique arrangements with banjo, piano, accordion, body percussion, featuring her latest, and songs from her solo albums.

The Wild Voice: Unique folk song learning, listening and exploration of ornament, timbre, language and phrasing to open mind and voice to the many contexts and colors of vocal expression.
